Please remove your shoes while in the motor home.

RV Systems

AC and Heating:

- The control is just outside the bathroom to the right of the door.
- For AC, toggle the horizontal button below the display till you see 'Cool Low' or Cool High' Auto, then use the up/down arrow buttons to set the temperature.
- For Heat, toggle the horizontal button below the display till you see 'Heat Gas' then use the up/down arrow buttons to set the temperature.
- Please do not use any of the other selections.
- · To turn off, toggle through the selections till you see 'Off'



Ventilation:

- There is a ceiling vent that is controlled by the remote that is mounted on the wall just inside the entrance door on the right.
- You can simply turn it on with the power button and use the up/down arrows to control the speed or you can press auto and set a temperature and the fan will adjust up or down to try to reach that temperature.
- When using the ventilation you will need to open the windows or the front door with the screen door in place.
- If using the cooktop to cook something that might burn it will be necessary to turn on the ceiling fan for the kitchen. The switch is far right hand switch on the wall to the right of the cooktop. If you forget, the smoke alarm will most likely go off.
- There is a ceiling exhaust fan in the bathroom with the on/off with located at the bottom of the fan. Make sure that the vent is open.



Lighting:


- There are a variety of lighting options around the interior of the motor home to create the ambiance of your choosing.
- All lights are LED.
- The overhead lights are controlled by two position switches (high/low) located on the left end panel of the kitchen by the entrance door and another switch outside the bathroom.
- The bathroom light is controlled from a switch just inside the bathroom on the wall and also has a two position switch.
- There are two lights available for the kitchen counter both controlled by switches on the left wall of the refrigerator. One is an under cabinet light and the other is a mood light.
- There are lights over the dinette with switches under the overhead cabinets.
- There are reading lights over each bed that turn on by pressing the button next to the light. These lights have blue and amber lights available that toggle by holding the button down.
- There are two outside lights available: one that lights the steps and one that is on the outside wall by the door. These are controlled by switches on the left end panel of the kitchen.

Bathroom:

- The toilet has a foot lever that flushes the toilet. This lever also needs to be used to fill the bowl prior to using it for solid waste.
- The toilet requires the use of special toilet paper. There are extra rolls under the sink.
- We've covered the vent and lights in the section above.
- The sink and shower can be used as normal but please try to be efficient with water use as we will have to empty the grey water tank prematurely. See Checking Tank Levels
- The shower head has a switch on ti to turn the water on and off to save water and keep your temperature settings.
- There is a hanging closet for your convenience to the left of the sink.

Checking Tank Levels:

- All the tanks will have been serviced prior to your stay.
- If you are staying with us for more than a few days you will need to check the tank levels once a day.
- The tank levels gauge is located behind the lift-up cabinet door above the refrigerator.



- Please let us know if you see that the waste tanks get above 2/3 full.
- Please let us know if the fresh water tank is under 1/3 full and we will fill it for you.

Beds:

- The Murphy bed will be in the up/stowed position on your arrival. This is a great way to maximize the space inside the motor home and the use of the sofa is also nice.
- To lower the bed, first release and extend the support legs as shown. Lift up until they lock in place.



- Lower the bed by pressing on the lower end of the top button on the outside of the bathroom wall to your left.
- Release the button once the support legs are resting on the floor. Be careful not to overextend when you are lowering.



- Before raising the bed, it is necessary to remove all pillows and extra blankets. The comforter can be left on the bed.
- To stow/raise the bed, press the upper end of the same switch until the bed is stowed.
- Release the support legs by pressing on the button and fold them in against the bed.



- Pillows and extra blankets are stored under the sofa.If you have requested to use the over the cab bed it is accessed from a ladder that is stowed to the left of the entrance door.
- Remove the ladder and hook the top into the bars in the middle of the edge of the bed and rest the bottom of the ladder on the floor. It is now ready to use to access the upper bed.
- Please be careful when using this bed as it does not have a railing.



Kitchen:

- There is filtered water from the faucet for cold water only.
- The faucet has a water saving feature that requires pulling down on the faucet after the water is turned on.



- Wash basins, the trash bin and cleaning supplies are located under the sink.
- Please leave the refrigerator setting where it is.
- There are dishes, utensils and cookware in the drawers below. Glassware and mugs are in the upper cabinet above the sink.
- We have provided a hot water kettle for tea and coffee.
- To use the cooktop you will need to use a lighter. There are lighters in the drawer under the cooktop.
- Turn the dial to 'Light' then light the burner. Once lit, turn the dial to the desired setting.



Kitchen cont.

Microwave/ Convection Oven:

OPERATION INSTRUCTION

1.Clock Setting

When the microwave oven is electrified, the oven will display "0:00", and buzzer will ring once.

The input time should be within 1:00-12:59.

Example: To set 12:12.

- (1) Press the " Clock" button, and the buzzer will ring once.
- (2) Press the number keys: "1","2","1","2" in order.
- (3) Press " Clock" to finish clock setting. ":" will flash, and the time will light.

Note: 1) If the clock is not set, "0:00" is displayed and the clock will not count.

2) During the process of clock setting, if you press "Stop/Clear", the oven will go back to the previous status automatically.

2. Kitchen Timer

- (1) Press " Kitchen Timer ", "0:00" is dispalyed.
- (2) Press the number keys to set the timing within the range of 99 minutes and 99 seconds. For example:

set kitchen timer as 12 minutes and 12 seconds, please press "1,2,1,2" in turn.

- (3) Press "Start/+30SEC." to confirm; time will count down and display.
- (4) When time counts to "0", the buzzer will sound 5 times and the oven will turn back to the normal state.

Note: (1) Kitchen timer is a timer as an alarm clock.

(2) In the timing state, the oven will not start with any program and the oven light will not light.

3. Microwave Cooking

Select different microwave power level and set cooking time as you wish. There are 10 power levels available for choosing. Keep on pressing "Power" to choose the power.

Level	10	9	8	7	6	5	4	3	2	1
Power	100%	90%	80%	70%	60%	50%	40%	30%	20%	10%
Display	PL10	PL9	PL8	PL7	PL6	PL5	PL4	PL3	PL2	PL1

Example: If you want to use 80% microwave power to cook for 10 minutes, you can operate the oven as the following steps.

- 1) Press "Power" once, the oven will display "PL10", " Micro." indicator will light.
- 2) Press "Power" twice again to choose 80% power, the oven will display "PL8".
- 3) Press the number buttons of "1","0","0","0" in order, the oven will display "10:00"
- 4) Press " Start/+30SEC." to start cooking, ":" will light and the "Micro." indicator will flash.

4. Grill/Micro.+Grill Combination Cooking

(1) Press the "Grill" button once to choose the grill function, the oven will display "G-1" and "Grill" indicator will light.(Press twice or thrice to choose the combination

- (2) Set the cooking time.
 - Example: Set 12 minutes 50 seconds, press "1", "2", "5", "0" in order.
- (3) Press " **Start/+30SEC**. " to start cooking. The cooking time counts down, ":" will light and " Grill " indicator will flash.

Note: If half the grill time passes, the oven sounds twice, and this is normal. It denotes turning food over in order to have a better effect of grilling food, and you should turn the food over, close the door, and then press" Start/+30SEC." to continue cooking.

Note: "Grill" Pad presses instructions

Presses Instructions	Display	Microwave	Grill
1	G-1		100%
2	G-2	36%	64%
3	G-3	55%	45%

5. Convection Cooking

There are ten temperatures of convection: 100F,150F,250F,275F,300F,325F,350F, 375F,400F,425F.

A. With preheating convection

- 1) Press the "Convec" once, the oven will display "100". "F" and " Conv."indicator will light. (Press the convection temperature key to select the temperature you need.)
- 2) Press " Start/+30SEC. " button to start preheating. The temperature figure will flash when the oven reach the temperature setted, and buzzer will ring twice to remind you to put food into the oven, then close the door.
- 3) Press the number keys to set cooking time.
- 4) Press the "Start/+30SEC." button to start cooking.
 - " Conv." indicator will flash, ":" will light, and cooking time will count down.

B. Convection Cooking(Without preheating function)

- 1) Press the "Convec" once, the oven will display "100". "F" and " Conv."indicator will light. (Press the convection temperature key to select the temperature you need.)
- 2) Press the "Convec" button to confirm the temperature.
- 3) Press the number keys to set cooking time.
- 4) Press the "Start/+30SEC." button to start cooking.
 - " Conv." indicator will flash, ":" will light, and cooking time will count down.

6. Convection Roast Cooking

- 1) Press " Roast" once, the oven will display "325F", and the "Micro.", "Conv." indicator will light.(Press the convection temperature key to select the temperature you need.)
- 2) Press " Roast" button to confirm the temperature.
- 3) Press the number keys to set cooking time.
- 4) Press " Start/+30SEC. " button to start cooking, ":" will light, and cooking time will count down.

Entertainment:

- Thanks to good WIFI speeds from our Starlink satellite system it is possible to stream entertainment on the TV.
- We have AppleTV with access to Netflix, Amazon Prime, AppleTV+, YouTube TV and YouTube.
- The remotes for the entertainment unit, TV and Apple TV are on the table.
- Turning on the system:
- Turn on the Jenson Entertainment unit using the power button on the remote. It is necessary to point the remote at the unit.
- Turn on the TV using the power button on the Insignia remote.
- Turn on the Apple TV by pressing the 'Menu' button on the Apple TV remote.
- Use the Apple TV remote to browse and select content.
- Adjust volume for the surrounding speakers using the Entertainment unit remote.
- Adjust the TV volume using the TV remote. We usually use a combination of the two.



7. Defrost By Weight

- 1) Press "Defrost" once, the oven will display "dEF1". "Micr.", "Defrost" indicators will light.
- 2) Press the number keys to set defrosting weight within the range of 4 to 100 oz, and "Oz" will light.
- 3) Press " Start/+30SEC. " button to start defrosting, and "Oz" will disappear.

8. Defrost By Time

- 1) Press "Defrost" twice, the oven will display "dEF2". "Micr.", "Defrost" indicators will light.
- 2) Press the number keys to set defrosting time.
- 3) Press " Start/+30SEC. " button to start defrosting.

9.Multi-Stage Cooking

Two stages of cooking can be maximumly set. If one of the stages is defrosting, then it should be put in the first stage. The buzzer will ring once after each stage cooking and the next stage will begin.

Note: Auto manu and keep warm cooking cannot be set as one of the multi-stage. Example: cooking with 100% microwave power for 5 minutes and then 70% microwave power for 10 minutes. The steps are as the following:

- 1) Press "Power" once, "PL10" is displayed;
- 2) Press number keys "5","0","0" to adjust the cooking time as you need;
- 3) Press "Power" four times to choose 70% microwave power, "PL7" is displayed;
- 4) Press number keys "1", "0", "0", "0" to adjust the cooking time as you need.
- 5) Press "Start/ +30 SEC." to start cooking.

10. Speedy Cooking

- (1) In waiting state, instant cooking at 100% power level can be started by selecting cooking time from 1 to 6 minutes by pressing numeral pads1 to 6. Press " **Start/ +30 SEC.** " to increase the cooking time 30 seconds by each added pressing; the maximum cooking time is 99 minutes and 99 seconds.
- (2) In waiting state, instant cooking at 100% power level with 30 seconds' cooking time can be started by pressing " Start/ +30 SEC. ". Each press on the same button will increase cooking time by 30 seconds. the maximum cooking time is 99 minutes and 99 seconds.

Note: In microwave, grill, convection or combination cooking state, 30 seconds' cooking time can be added by each pressing of "**Start/ +30 SEC.**" button, and it's invalid at the functon of defrost, mulit-stage or auto menu cooking.

DVD PLAYER WITH DELUXE SOUND

-If Equipped

The DVD Player is a selectable function of the multi-featured audio system. The player unit contains DVD/CD, MP3, AM/FM, USB, and Bluetooth Stereo. It also accepts portable audio player inputs and functions as an alarm clock.

This stereo receives Bluetooth streaming audio from Bluetooth enabled audio sources such as a cellphone.

The player is connected directly to the TV and can output sound to either the stereo speakers in the TV or to the Deluxe Sound speakers in the lounge area of the coach.

Interior Speaker System



Interior Speaker Switch "SPEAKER A"

 To connect or disconnect the interior speaker system, press SPEAKER A.

Set TV Video Input

- Turn TV and Radio/DVD player ON.
- Press the MODE button on the TV or the SOURCE button on the remote to select "INPUT 2".
- The TV screen will display the DVD player logo when the correct input is selected.



Play DVD

- Insert a DVD "face up" into slot on lower face of the player.
- The DVD will begin to load automatically. The TV screen will typically display "Reading" or "Loading".
- The DVD may load directly to the main title/menu screen or it may begin to play previews. You may be able to skip previews if desired by pressing the "Next" button on the DVD remote until you see the main menu screen.
- When the main menu screen appears, press the "Enter" button on the remote or "Play/Pause" button on DVD player to begin playing the main feature. Use the arrow buttons on the DVD remote to select another feature to play.
- Volume is adjusted with the DVD remote.

TV Sound through Deluxe Sound Speakers

When watching TV programs alone, the TV normally plays sound through its own built-in stereo speakers. If you wish to connect TV stereo sound output to the Deluxe Sound speakers for a richer sound quality, follow these steps:

- 1. Turn the TV ON.
- 2. Make sure the Interior Speaker System is ON.

SECTION 8 – ENTERTAINMENT

- Press the AUX input selection button (located just below the display on the face of the Radio/ DVD Player.) This will route the TV stereo sound output through the Radio/DVD Player and out to the Deluxe Sound speakers.
- Select TV channels and adjust volume using the TV remote.

DVD PLAYER WITH DELUXE SOUND

-If Equipped



The DVD player is a selectable function of the multi-featured audio system. The player unit contains many features including: DVD/CD/MP3 player, AM/FM tuner, USB, Bluetooth, and Weatherband with weather alert. It also functions as an alarm clock.

This stereo receives Bluetooth streaming audio from Bluetooth enabled audio sources such as a cellphone.

The player is connected directly to the TV and can output sound to either the stereo speakers in the TV or to the Deluxe Sound speakers in the lounge area of the coach.

Set TV Video Input

- Turn TV and DVD player ON.
- Press the SOURCE button on the TV or DVD player remote and select "HDMI".

 The TV screen will display the DVD player logo when the correct input is selected.



Play DVD

- Insert DVD face up into disc slot.
- The DVD will begin to load automatically.
 The TV screen will typically display
 READING or LOADING.
- The DVD may load directly to the main title/menu screen or it may begin to play previews. You may be able to skip previews if desired by pressing the NEXT button on the DVD player remote until you see the main menu screen.
- When the main menu screen appears, press the ENTER button on the DVD player remote or PLAY/PAUSE button on DVD player to begin playing the main feature. Use the arrow buttons on the DVD remote to select another feature to play.
- Volume is adjusted with the DVD remote.

TV Sound through Deluxe Sound Speakers

-If Equipped

When watching TV programs alone, the TV normally plays sound through its own built-in stereo speakers. If you wish to connect TV stereo sound output to the Deluxe Sound speakers for a richer sound quality, follow these steps:

- 1. Turn the TV ON.
- Press the Source button (located on the face of the DVD player) and select Rear AUX This will route the TV stereo sound output through the DVD player and out to the Deluxe Sound speakers.
- 3. Select TV channels and adjust volume using the TV remote.

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Bluetooth:

- It is possible to pair your phone to this unit to enjoy music through the house speakers. Turn the unit on. Press the mode display button until the display shows 'BT'
- Make sure your device is powered on.
- The unit is labeled JWM6A
- With the unit in BT mode, press and hold the 'Enter Search' button for four seconds.
- When the mobile device has completed its search it will display JWM6A. Select this.
- If needed select 'BT PAUSE' and enter the paring password.
